

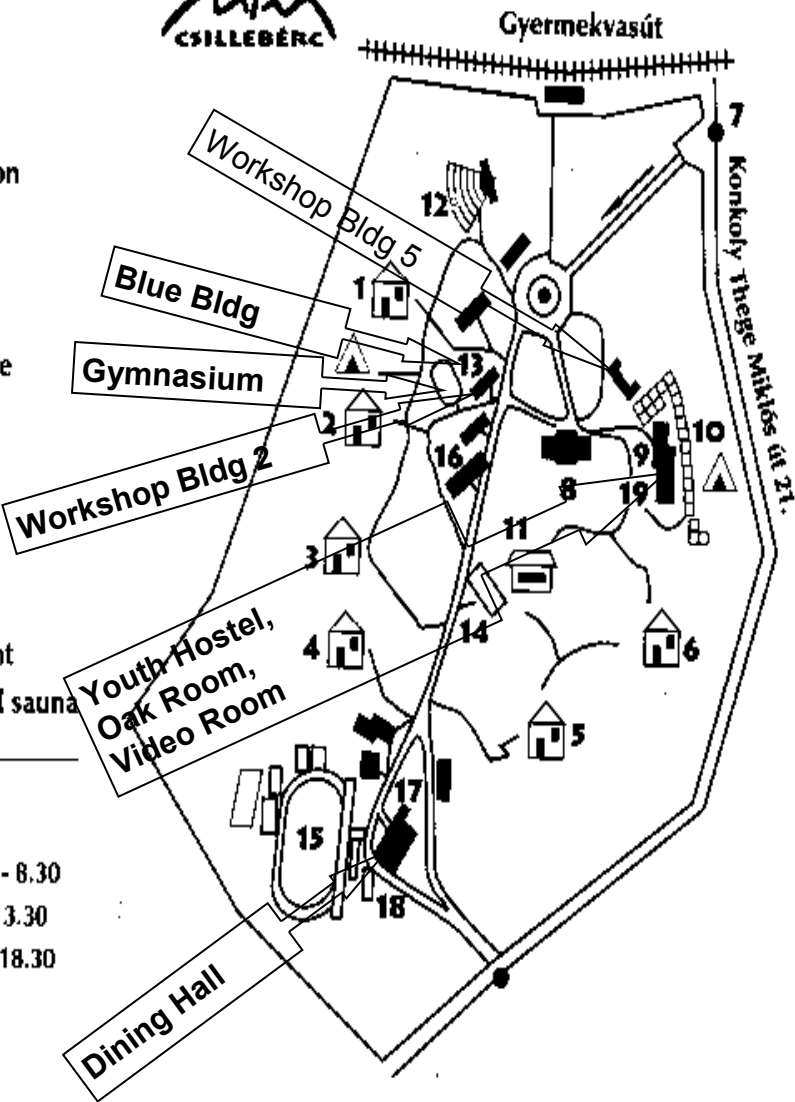

Instructions

REGISTRATION

After registering – get settled under the direction of your chaperone and then go to the dining hall for dinner (17.30).

Wear your name tag to all sessions, discussion sessions and meals so others can get to know you and so you can address others by more than “Hey, you!”

MEALS

All meals will be at the self-service Restaurant (see map on page 8). Don't forget to *BRING YOUR NAME TAG* with you as it also serves as your meal ticket! The dining hall is about a 3 minute walk from the gymnasium. Lunches are usually three-course meals and dinners are two. Please wait patiently for your turn at meals, do not skip the line - if you would like to join your group, join **BEFORE** standing in the line. Please **DO NOT** take meals out of the dining hall for yourself or others. Be a good witness to the servers. Give thanks on your own and enjoy your meal.

SCHEDULE

Follow the schedule carefully. **Be on time for all activities and sessions.** One mark of a good leader is that he knows how to be a conscientious and supportive follower. Encourage each other and show appreciation to others who make helpful contributions to discussions, etc. Be patient in listening to each other because English is not the first language for all of you.

You are expected to be in each general session, a discussion group, one of the workshops (chosen by you) in each session, at all meals, and at all other scheduled activities.

Free time and the time before and after meals and sessions may be spent relaxing, sleeping, interacting with others from other schools, or participating in the planned activities. Use the time to get to know others.

Guidelines and Information

1. Be encouraged to get up on time and make good use of prayer and devotional time.
2. Be encouraged to make new friends across cultures.
3. Try to be pleasant even if everything is not to your liking.
4. Exhibit behavior that keeps you safe and under control (e.g. recreation time), as well as considerate of others (e.g. avoid cutting in lines).
5. Participate in every general session, discussion group session, and workshop session.
6. Be on time for all sessions so we can stay on schedule.
7. Bring Bibles to all general sessions and workshops.
8. Participate fully in the student-led discussion groups.
9. Sign out/return recreation equipment (otherwise you will need to pay for replacement).
10. Remain on the grounds throughout the conference.
11. See one of the nurses if sick or injured (nurses will attend all sessions and be highly visible. At night they will be in Bungalow I, Room 1. (Phone numbers of staff are listed below if you need additional help)
12. Be in your rooms and get settled for the night within one half hour of the conclusion of the evening sessions.
13. Stay out of rooms of the opposite sex.
14. Avoid smoking and other harmful practices.

Violation of the guidelines will be viewed seriously.

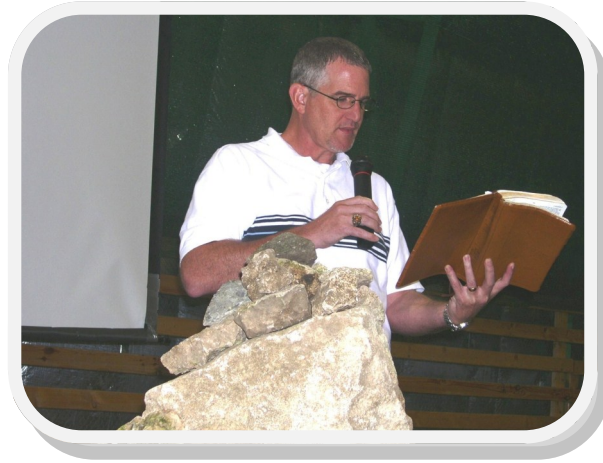

Biographical Information of Pastor Paul Goodnight



Paul was born in Wurzburg, Germany in 1958. He lived in Oklahoma and Washington before his father retired from the military and moved the family to their permanent home in Atlanta, Georgia. Paul trusted Christ as his Savior at age 8 while attending a summer camp in Franklin, North Carolina. Paul graduated from Florida Bible College and has done course work at Tampa Bay Theological Seminary. He has ministered full time with two music groups, “Malachi” and “The Sound of Truth Quartet,” spending a total of five years on the road. He spent seven years on staff at Florida Bible College - the first five years as the Dean of Students and the remainder as the Chairman of the Management Team. Paul, his wife Leigh and their three children Whitney, Curtis, and Ally moved to Virginia in 1993 where he currently serves as the Staff Pastor and member of the Executive Pastor Team at Reston Bible church.

This is Paul’s third time as our keynote speaker for SLC. We are very pleased that Paul has accepted our invitation to come back.

3. Name three things that could remind you of God's goodness when you are faced with hardship.
4. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, what would you dream of accomplishing for God's glory?
